

BEFORE YOU VISIT THE MDC

Students will become science investigators during their time at the Marine Discovery Centre. To help them prepare for their visit, we encourage students to do some exploring and think about some questions:

Classroom discussion questions

- 1. What is the role of the Marine Discovery Centre? What is our purpose?
- 2. Why do we need to care for our environment and marine creatures?
- 3. How can we care for our environment and marine creatures? How can you make a difference?
- 4. Discuss some South Australian marine creatures. What makes them special to South Australia?
- 5. What do marine creatures need in the environment to survive?
- 6. What is the current condition of sand dunes in metropolitan Adelaide?

What to bring

- 1. Clipboards and pencils for students to record (optional: printed worksheets that have been provided by the MDC)
- 2. A crate or small students backpacks for recess, lunch and drink bottles
- 3. A rubbish bag as the MDC is a zero waste destination
- 4. Name tags for students and adults.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE MDC

At the Marine Discovery Centre, students will be given the opportunity to explore the environment of Henley Beach. Students will participate in a marine trail. They will learn and interact within the four rooms of the centre. Students will see live South Australian marine creatures in our aquariums. For the safety of our marine creatures we ask that while inside the centre, students are to walk and speak quietly.
