

HERMIT CRAB





Beachcombing

Always be careful on the beach:

Take a hand lens or magnifying glass for closer inspection.

Help the environment and take any rubbish safely home with you – recycle or place it in the bin.

Take your camera to help you to capture memories of your finds.

Leave marine life on the beach where you found it – each plant and animal plays an important part in the environment.

Intertidal Zone

The intertidal area (also called the littoral zone) is where the land and sea meet, between the high and low tide zones. This complex marine ecosystem is found along coastlines worldwide. It is rich in nutrients and oxygen and is home to a variety of organisms.

Animals that live on the beach include ghost crabs, ghost shrimps, clam and oysters. Others include snails, seastars and sea anemones. Though the beach seems nearly devoid of life, it provides feeding and nesting for a number of species.

Creatures living on the beach include anemones, sand fleas, clams, crabs, and bloodworm. Some of these animals reside deep in the sand during the day, and others hide in clumps of rotting seaweed. They reside at the surface because it is rich in nutrients and oxygen.
